BOROUGH OF WILMERDING NOTES FROM THE MARCH 3, 2020 WORKSHOP

L. KIRK: I received the inventory list from the Fire Department and Certifications should be coming as well.

K. MAXWELL: Just waiting for information on the timeclock.

A. PRINCE: 413 Welsh/Orient slide, PA Soil & Rock has concerns removing 10' of material may have a negative impact on the homes on Welsh Avenue. They suggest that an additional study with more test holes to determine if these slides are connected. Dave recommends that we proceed with this additional work so we can formulate a plan. We also inspected the storm sewer that runs along Orient Avenue and found that it is 70% collapsed. We may want to relocate this pipe to run down Clara Street. This would be part of the slide remediation work. Ice plant Hill drainage project application will be submitted this month to ALCOSAN. The Herman Avenue storm sewer separation project is scheduled to start within the next 2 weeks. The DPW ceiling is a mystery, there were no problems found with the storm sewer on Commerce Street so our next though is to consider reconstructing the drain, which was filled in years ago when it broke, to collect any and all water coming down the hill from Wall Street.

S. SHURGOT: the garage leaked even when that trench was there so I'm not 100% sold on that fix.

A. PRINCE: I will make a not of that and let Dave know.

J. THOMAS: I think it is still worth the cost of doing that because when we have a heavy rain you should see the water coming down the hill and flooding out Station Street.

A. PRINCE: Satira will start the 2019 Storm Inlet Project when it gets warmer. The applications for the GTRP grants for recreation projects are open. We talked about some ideas last month like the Community Center court resurfacing and retaining wall, the fencing in Airbrake Park and the Belgian block in the Wilmerding Park. Have you decided which projects you want to submit for?

J. THOMAS: so you're talking 2, 1 for the Community Center and 1 for Airbrake Avenue

A. PRINCE: also the one at Wilmerding Park for the block and electrical.

S. SHURGOT: I think the electrical at the Park is a necessity. So everybody agrees the Wilmerding Park and the Airbrake Avenue Park to finish that park up.

G. EVASHAVIK: the Herman Avenue Speed reduction needed a traffic study so we can get together a new ordinance.

J. THOMAS: Could you try to talk to County Maintenance about Patton Street storm sewer that is all collapsed and the ramp from the Airbrake has a catch basin that must have collapsed as well.

A. PRINCE: I will let Dave know and see if he can get the County out to do repairs.
