#### PARKING ON BORO STREETS

The only exception to this Ordinance is if you live on a oneway street. This Ordinance will be highly enforced by Allegheny County Police.

## RECREATIONAL FACILITES HOURS

All recreational areas in the Boro are closed from 10 PM until Sunrise.

#### Avenue U

Small tot lot facility for ages 10 and under with 1/2 size basket-ball court for use by residents.

## RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN TOWN

#### Airbrake Ave

Swing set and small tot lot for children (ages 10 and under please)—small basketball court for ages up to 14 or enjoy the walking trail.

#### **Wilmerding Park**

Site of many town activities, concerts in the park, movies in the park. Many benches for relaxation. Great for walking around 1 lap around is equal to .225 of a mile.





#### Memorial Field-(Next TO WCC)

Ball Field, Tot playground (ages 10 and under please) Pavilion with picnic tables.

#### **Municipal Building**

Community Room available for use for your event.

All of these areas are free for use by residents with the exception of the community room. You may rent Wilmerding Park, Memorial Field or the Community Room for your event by contacting the Borough Secretary.

#### **GARBAGE PICKUP**

#### TRASH PICKUP DAY

Regular trash pickup day is Thursday. Garbage will be delayed one day for Memorial Day. Trash must be placed at curb or it will not be picked up.

Trash may not be placed at the curb prior to 6 pm on Wednesday evening.

Failure to comply with this ordinance will result in a fine.

#### TRASH CAN'S

Trash cans must be removed from the curb within 24 hours of trash pickup.

#### **GREEN GROCER**

Stop by the Allegheny County High Rise on Friday's between 2 pm and 3 pm and pick up some fresh produce, meats, and other items. They accept cash, check, debit, and EBT cards.

#### WHAT IS PICKED UP

Branches, hedges and carpet that is rolled and tied in sections no longer than 3 foot in length will be picked up . You may place 1 large item out per week. Refrigerators and air conditioning units will only be picked up if the Freon is removed and an orange Freon removal tag is affixed to the unit.

A safety note – Please remove the refrigerator door prior to placing the unit at the curb.

They will not take building materials, paint cans or thinner, batteries, tires, or TV's

#### OCCUPANCY PERMITS

All new residents must obtain an occupancy permit <u>prior to moving</u> <u>into a home or an apartment.</u>

If you are renting, the landlord is responsible for obtaining this occupancy permit. If you do not have proof of an occupancy permit you will be asked to leave the premises until one is obtained.

Failure to comply with this ordinance will result in a \$300.00 fine.

You are limited to a total of two dogs or two cats or a combination there of in your residence. If you wish to have more than a total of 2 dogs or cats at your residence a permit must be obtained through the Borough Office. The cost is \$15.00
